

Marina Rules

The following rules have been established to provide for the efficient and harmonious operation of the Marina and for the safety of the Licensee and visitors to the Marina.

The Marina Rules should be read in conjunction with the terms of this Licence.

When a vessel enters the Marina it immediately comes under the jurisdiction of the Marina Management and is required to comply with Eastland Port Limited harbour regulations and directions and the Maritime Safety Authority rules and regulations.

Obstruction of Entrance and Piers

- 1 The Licensee must not obstruct any of the entrances to the Marina or use them for any purpose other than for ingress to and egress from the Marina. There must be no obstruction of the pier entrances.

Access

- 2 The Licensee will be issued with two swipe cards for two keys for accessing the Marina on the commencement of the Licence. Any replacement swipe cards or keys will be issued at the Licensee's cost.

Berth Lines

- 3 The Licensee must use the standard of berth lines provided from by EIPL for the purpose of berth vessels occupying the berth. The Licensee must pay the cost of providing the berth lines and fixing, repairing and replacing such lines when reasonably required by EIPL. Should the berth lines prove to be inadequate, no liability must attach to the EIPL.

Services

- 4 The Licensee may use the services in common with other Licensees and persons authorised by EIPL on an occasional basis only. If the Licensee requires more regular use of any services than such use must be subject to the prior written approval of EIPL which may make an extra charge to cover the costs of providing such services. The Licensee must (a) not use any services for a purpose for which they were not designed, and (b) utilise only appropriate fittings which comply with all relevant codes and regulations.

Navigation

- 5 The Licensee must not moor or navigate any vessel within the navigation area so as to create a danger, impediment, obstacle or inconvenience to another vessel.

Security

- 6 The Licensee must take all reasonable steps to protect any vessel occupying the berth from theft and vandalism and must keep all hatches and other openings closed and securely fastened when such vessel is not in use.

Fire Hazards

- 7 The Licensee must not do anything in the Marina which creates a fire hazard, or which may contravene the regulations or bylaws of any authority and without limitation.

Refuelling

8 All refuelling must be carried out only at the designated refuelling area indicated by the Marina Manager (021 646 218). Refuelling must be carried out by Rural Fuel or Mini Tankers and should be in compliance with the Resource Management Act.

Dangerous Goods

9 The Licensee must not bring into, store or use within the Marina any chemicals inflammable goods, fluids or substances except in the ordinary course of using the Nominated Vessel for recreational purposes.

Conduct and Noise

10 The Licensee must not make any improper noise or interfere with any other Licensees or persons lawfully in the Marina. Noise must be kept to a minimum at all times and the Licensee must not create a nuisance by the use of television, radio, musical apparatus, or any other form of sound reproduction. No unlawful activities must be conducted from the Nominated vessel of the berth. Halyards are to be restrained so as to eliminate halyard noise.

Rubbish

11 The Licensee must not deposit any rubbish, effluent, or other pollutants in any part of the Marina other than in the receptacles provided.

Notice of defects

12 The Licensee must promptly notify EIPL on becoming aware of any defect of damage to the Marina.

Alcohol

13 The Licensee must not consume alcohol within the Marina (except on private vessels or on licences premises or other premises where consumption of alcohol is not prohibited by law).

Storage

14 The Licensee must not store any property, gear or equipment under the control or direction of the Licensee in the Marina without the prior written consent of EIPL.

No swimming

15 The Licensee must not swim or dive within the Marina provided that the Licensee may carry out bottom scrubbing of the Nominated Vessel subject to such reasonable directions as EIPL may stipulate from time to time.

Living on Board

16 The Licensee must not live or stay overnight on board any vessel occupying the berth.

Animals

17 The Licensee must not permit any animal in the Licensee's control to enter or remain in the Marina unless properly restrained and provided it does not disturb other persons. The Licensee must be responsible for promptly cleaning up any fouling caused by any pets brought to the Marina by the Licensee or any invitees of the Licensee.

Emergency Contract

18 The Licensee must advise EIPL of the name and telephone number of a person other than the Licensee who can be contacted by EIPL in the event of an emergency.



Visitors to the Marina

19 The Licensee must ensure that (a) all its invitees comply with the terms of the berth licence and (b) any children under the age of 13 and for whom the Licensee or its visitors are responsible, are accompanied by an adult.

Skateboards, rollerblades, bikes

20 The Licensee must not use skateboards, roller blades, motorcycles or bicycles on the piers or floating components.

Height Restriction

21 Airport authorities have established regulations governing heights of boat masts. Compliance with these regulations is paramount. Details are contained in your berth licence.

Workmen

22 When employed by the Licensee, workmen must first have attended Eastland Group's health and safety induction for contractors, comply with EIPLs health and safety requirements and have their own work site safety plan in place.

Sewerage pump out facilities

23 Discharge of sewage and waste water into the harbour is prohibited.

Berth Size

24 The overall length of your vessel must not exceed the maximum length of the berth you are occupying. No part of any vessel must overhang the pier finger by more than 10% of the finger length.

Sailing

25 No sailing is permitted in the harbour.

Boat Repairs

26 All boat repairs including welding, gas cutting, discussions sanding or grinding and spray painting must be approved by EIPL Manager before commencing.

Fenders

27 Only approved fendering systems, approved by EIPL or an authorised person of EIPL can be used.

Power Points

28 All leads and appliances connected to the Marina power outlet must comply with the relevant regulations.

Signs

29 All signs relating to the use of the License Area and Marina directions issued by EIPL must be complied with.

Circulars

30 No distribution of circulars or pamphlets on vessels will be permitted.
